AAVS Interschool Lecture Round 2023: Lecture call - due 21st April 2023

AAVS is pleased to announce the upcoming 2023 AAVS Interschool Lecture Round, which will take place online between May - July 2023. This lecture series aims to increase awareness of future disease outbreaks and how current preparedness might bе taken to anticipate a future pandemic. The main topic is a Veterinary Update Infectious and Emerging Disease and One-Health Approach Management to Future Emerging Disease.

The event will consist of three 2-hour sessions featuring keynote speakers who will cover various topics related to veterinary science, including updates on African swine fever, monkeypox, and Newcastle Disease. The lecture series is open to all students from AAVS Member campuses, either bachelor or rotational students.

The 2023 AAVS Interschool Lecture Round is an excellent opportunity for all students and faculty members to enhance their understanding and capacity in several topic areas related to a One-Health approach in veterinary science.

In 2022, AAVS and FAVA have established a joint education committee to develop a common self-assessment tool for Asian veterinary schools. As part of this collaboration, the AAVS Veterinary Education Enhancement Working Group (VEE-WG) is inviting all AAVS Member institutions to participate in an online survey.

The survey aims to collect information about the status of Day-1-Competencies (D1C) and Core Curriculum (CC) in each country and educational institution in Asia. The information collected will serve as a reference to develop D1C and CC in Asia through a collaborative effort between AAVS and FAVA.


AAVS Annual Membership Update

Introduction of

Faculty of Veterinary Medicine and Animal Sciences, University of Peradeniya

New member of AAVS Executive Committee



The Faculty of Veterinary Medicine and Animal Science (FVMAS) at the University of Peradeniya is the only higher education institution in Sri Lanka course imparting study of veterinarians. The BVSc undergraduate training programme commenced in 1947 with the establishment of the Department of Veterinary Clinical Sciences within the Faculty of Medicine, University of Ceylon in the capital, Colombo. The intake at the

inception was 2 students per year. In 1954, this department was shifted to Peradeniya in the central hills and incorporated into the Faculty of Agriculture and Veterinary Science of the University of Ceylon. The preclinical courses however continued to be taught in Colombo until 1966. In 1973 the Department of Veterinary Science was upgraded to a School of Veterinary Science within a Faculty of Medical, Dental and Veterinary Sciences of the Peradeniya Campus of the University of Sri Lanka. The new School consisted of three departments viz. Departments of Veterinary Preclinical, Paraclinical and Clinical Studies, and the Animal Science component of the course was taught by the Department of Animal Science, Faculty of Agriculture. In early 1980, the BVSc training programme received full-fledged faculty status. At present the FVMAS consists of five departments, namely Dept. of Basic Veterinary Sciences, Veterinary Pathobiology, Veterinary Public Health and Pharmacology, Veterinary Clinical Sciences, and Farm Animal Production and Health together with many service function units.

The Bachelor of Veterinary Science curriculum underwent formal revisions during 1991 and 2000 to align it with international veterinary educational norms at the time. However, the most revolutionary

curriculum revision came in 2020 under the World Organization for Animal Health (WOAH) twinning program with Massey University, New Zealand, which extended the BVSc degree course from four to five years in keeping with internationally accepted veterinary present, degree programmes. A lecture-free final year with industry-based externship appointments are key features in this new curriculum. The annual student intake at present is 130 students per batch. The present employability of the veterinary graduates is 100%, and they are being employed both locally and overseas in diverse state-based and private organisations related to animal health and production, public health, academia, and research.
